Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement

*Protocol Amending the Agreement Between Canada and the United States of America
on Great Lakes Water Quality, 1978, as Amended on October 16, 1983,
and on November 18, 1987*

*Signed September 7, 2012
Entered into force February 12, 2013*



Canada

The Agreement was signed in Washington, DC on September 7, 2012 by the Minister of the Environment, Peter Kent, on behalf of Canada, and by the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Lisa Jackson, on behalf of the United States.



Through the Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement of 2012, the Governments of Canada and the United States recognize the vital importance of the Great Lakes to Canada, the United States, and the world, ecologically, economically, and socially, and reaffirm and renew their commitment to restore, conserve and protect these shared waters for the benefit, use and enjoyment of current and future generations.
