Dear Chairman Calvert and Ranking Member McCollum,

As members of the Great Lakes Legislative Caucus from the Great Lakes states, we are writing to express our very strong support for the federal Great Lakes Restoration Initiative (GLRI). The Great Lakes Legislative Caucus is a nonpartisan, binational organization of state and provincial legislators from the eight states and two Canadian provinces that share the Great Lakes. As state legislators from the Great Lakes region, we are keenly aware of the ecological and economic importance of the Great Lakes to our states. They are a source of drinking water for nearly 40 million people in two nations. According to the 2011 "Great Lakes Jobs Report," over 1.5 million jobs are directly connected to the lakes, generating \$62 billion annually in wages in manufacturing, tourism, shipping, and other industries. Our Great Lakes are both a natural wonder and a vital economic engine that deserve our unwavering support.

The GLRI enables vital work to proceed in cleaning up toxic sites, reducing runoff that contributes to harmful algal blooms, restoring habitat, and preventing and controlling invasive species. To continue this work, we feel very strongly that GLRI funding in the FY 2016 Interior, Environment and Related Agencies Appropriations bill should, at a minimum, be maintained at \$300 million consistent with FY 2015 funding. Since its inception in 2010, the GLRI has been responsible for a great deal of progress, perhaps most notably the cleanup of toxic hotspots, or Areas of Concern (AOCs), around the lakes. Our states and local communities benefit directly from the work being funded by the initiative, including several projects that have led to the delisting of Pennsylvania's Presque Isle Bay AOC and the Deer Lake and White Lake AOCs in Michigan. GLRI-funded projects also have led to the completion of cleanup activities at three additional AOCs in Illinois, Ohio, and Wisconsin, with ten additional projects slated to be completed by 2019. To complete these and other GLRI projects for the benefit of our region's economy and the environment, consistent funding must be maintained.

We also voice our strong support for legislation to authorize the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative. Formal authorization of the GLRI will provide greater coordination and continuity for restoration and protection projects, thereby improving the health of our region's mosttreasured natural resource. We are very pleased to see that bills have been introduced in both the House and the Senate to authorize the GLRI through FY 2020, and that both bills have bipartisan support from members of Congress from the Great Lakes region. By copy of this letter to the Congressional delegations from the Great Lakes states, we encourage their action in support of the GLRI and its authorization.
