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What is the Great Lakes Commission?

- A public agency established by the Great Lakes Basin Compact in 1955
- In 1968, Congress passed an act authorizing its consent to the Compact and the interstate compact agency.
- Ontario and Québec officially joined as associate members in 1999
- Allows its Member states and provinces speak with a unified voice and to reach consensus on and advocate for the region's priorities





Who is the Great Lakes Commission?



- Commissioners: 3-5 from each of the 10 states and provinces
- Board of Directors: 1 from each state / province delegation
- Chair: Todd Ambs, Wisconsin
- Professional Staff



GLC Actions on Climate Resilience





Defining a Resilient Great Lakes Basin GLC Definition:

A resilient Great Lakes Basin is one in which communities, infrastructure, ecosystems, and the economy can withstand, adapt to, and recover from climate-related stressors and changing conditions to ensure equitable and inclusive social, economic, and environmental well-being across the Basin.



Draft Action Plan: Goals

- Individuals and Communities are healthy, thriving, and adapted to the effects of changing conditions and climaterelated stressors.
- Buildings and infrastructure are safe and can withstand the effects of a changing conditions and climate-related stressors.
- Ecosystems are healthy throughout the Great Lakes Basin from changing conditions and climate-related stressors.
- Environmental and public services support economic activity and building resiliency.



Goal: Individuals & Communities

• Recommended Actions:

- The Great Lakes community shares ongoing projects to understand cumulative effort and gaps related to climate resilience
- The Great Lakes community engages in active listening to incorporate local input to assess needs, concerns, and potential solutions. Connecting community concerns with elected officials.

Recommended Outputs:

- GLC establishes regular meetings for the Great Lakes community to share expertise and coordinate on activities related to climate resilience
- Federal, state, provincial, and municipal authorities utilize a common forum (including a diverse cross-section of community members) to coordinate resilience efforts at a watershed level. The GLC could help facilitate this forum.



Goal: Buildings & Infrastructure

- Recommended Action:
 - Great Lakes community convenes forum to share best practices and identify opportunities for collaboration related to coastal resilience
- Recommended Output:
 - U.S. Army Corps of Engineers completes the Great Lakes Coastal Resiliency Study to identify coastal areas that could be vulnerable to climate-related stressors, identify range approaches to improve coastal resilience, establish a collaborative framework to support the effective management of coastal resources, and identify, select, and prioritize future coastal investments



Goal: Buildings & Infrastructure

- Recommended Action:
 - GLC advocates for investments in the Great Lakes Navigation System that increase system resilience to changing conditions
- Recommended Output:
 - The Great Lakes community develops climate resilience plan/roadmap for maritime transportation infrastructure



Goal: Buildings & Infrastructure

- Recommended Action:
 - GLC advocates for water infrastructure investments by the U.S. federal government that respond to and address climate stressors in the Great Lakes basin
- Recommended Output:
 - GLC develops an infrastructure blueprint for the Great Lakes basin to guide future investments



Goal: Ecosystems

• Recommended Actions:

- GLC convenes forum for the Great Lakes community to share experience and expertise related to ecosystem restoration, protection, and management
- GLC advocates for ecosystem restoration, protection, and management investment by federal governments

• Recommended Outputs:

- States and provinces share best practices on shoreline planning, development, and management on a basin-wide scale
- GLC provides a resilient ecosystems blueprint to inform regional investments



Goal: Economy

- Recommended Action:
 - Convene private sector, state, provincial, local & regional economic development entities to discuss/highlight opportunities related to the blue economy
- Recommended Output:
 - GLC engages state, provincial, local, and regional economic development entities to implement the Action Plan for Growing the Great Lakes Blue Economy



Goal: Economy

• Recommended Actions:

- GLC evaluates and publicizes economic impact of resilient investments in the Great Lakes
- GLC identifies suitable case studies from the public and private sectors to showcase transferability and lessons learned
- GLC assesses regional clusters/regional development plans to identify best practices, identify innovative financing options for localities

Recommended Outputs:

- GLC partners with Great Lakes community to highlight economic impact of new and existing resilient infrastructure investments
- GLC partners with Great Lakes community to flag areas of higher risk & connect businesses and local governments to assessments
- GLC partners with Great Lakes community to highlight new and existing climate resilience efforts via the Blue Accounting platform
